# BILLOW PILLOW

A KNITTING PATTERN



# IN THIS PATTERN

#### **STITCHES**

Knit (K)
Purl (P)
Cable (C2B, C2F, C4B, C4F)

#### STUFF FOR KNITTING

Bulky weight cotton yarn (Knit Picks Billow)
A Light shade (Ice Lily) - 2 hanks
B Dark shade (Comfrey) - 3 hanks
Knitting needles - US size 10 / 6.0 mm
Large blunt-tipped sewing needle

#### STUFF FOR SEWING

1 yardmeter heavy weight fabric (corduroy)16" x 26" pillow form (Ikea Fjädrar)16" coil zipperThread, measuring tape, scissors, pins

#### **BLOCKED SIZE**

A Light shade - 13" wide by 16" high B Dark shade - 2 pieces, each 7" wide by 16" high

#### **GAUGE**

12 stitches and 19 rows to 4 in (10 cm) square



## LET'S GET KNITTING

#### **KNIT THE CABLES\***

Using A, cast on 55 stitches. Repeat the pattern below 10 times and then bind off:

**Row 1:** K1, P2, C2B, P2, C4B, C4F, P2, C2B, P2, K6, P1, K6, P2, C2F, P2, C4B, C4F, P2, C2F, P2, K1

**Row 2:** P1, K2, P2, K2, P8, K2, P2, K2, P6, K1, P6, K2, P2, K2, P8, K2, P2, K2, P1

**Row 3:** P3, C2B, P2, K8, P2, C2B, P2, C6B, P1, C6F, P2, C2F, P2, K8, P2, C2F, P3,

**Row 4:** K3, P2, K2, P8, K2, P2, K2, P6, K1, P6, K2, P2, K2, P8, K2, P2, K3

**Row 5:** K1, P2, C2B, P2, C4F, C4B, P2, C2B, P2, K6, P1, K6, P2, C2F, P2, C4F, C4B, P2, C2F, P2, K1

**Row 6:** P1, K2, P2, K2, P8, K2, P2, K2, P6, K1, P6, K2, P2, K2, P8, K2, P2, K2, P1

**Row 7:** P3, C2B, P2, K8, P2, C2B, P2, K6, P1, K6, P2, C2F, P2, K8, P2, C2F, P3

**Row 8:** K3, P2, K2, P8, K2, P2, K2, P6, K1, P6, K2, P2, K2, P8, K2, P2, K3

\*Cable sequence based on a free knitting pattern: Hayfield 9683 - Cable Detail Poncho





#### **KNIT THE SIDES**

Using B, cast on 30 stitches. Work 80 rows in the following sequence:

**Row 1:** K30 **Row 2:** P30

Bind off and repeat to make the 2nd side.

#### **BLOCK YOUR KNITS**

Wetting your knits and letting them air dry lets you tell your stitches where to sit.

Spray your 3 knit pieces with water and gently shape your project to the below dimensions, then let them air dry.

A Light shade (cables) - 13" wide by 16" high B Dark shade (sides) - 2 pieces, each 7" wide by 16" high

#### STITCH 'EM TOGETHER

Lay out the 3 knit pieces with the dark pieces to either side of the lighter cabled piece. Stitch together with a slip stitch.









## LET'S GET SEWING

Cut2 rectangles from your heavy weight fabric - 16" high by 26.5" long.

#### **ADD A ZIPPER**

- 1. On the wrong side of one fabric piece, draw a line 3" down from the top of your fabric. The line should be 14" wide, centered in the middle.
- 2. Draw a parallel line 1/2" below the first.
- 3. Draw a line down the middle of these 2 lines, and draw a triangle from the corners out to the center line 1/4" in (figure 1).
- 4. Stitch around the outside of your rectangle with a short stitch length.

- 5. Clip along the center line until you reach the triangle, then snip into the corners close to your stitching.
- 6. Press the edges under neatly and pin the zipper in place (figure 2).
- 7. With your zipper foot, stitch around the edge of the zipper in a rectangle.

If you'd like more detailed instructions on how to add a zipper, I learned this method from So Sew Easy's article called "How to add a zipper pocket to any purse pattern".

## **PUT IT ALL TOGETHER**

Now that you've got all the pieces knitted, blocked, and prepped, we're ready to stitch everything together and finish up!

- 1. Unzip your zipper so you can turn the pillow right-side-out once it's sewn.
- 2. Pin your layers together. One piece of fabric should be on either side of the knit, with wrong sides facing out (figure 3).
- 3. Stitch around all edges with a 1/4" seam allowance, ensuring all 3 layers are caught in the seam.
- 4. Turn right side out.
